MAKE AN EMERGENCY PLAN INFORMED

KNOWING WHAT TO DO BEFORE AN EMERGENCY IS YOUR BEST PROTECTION AND, YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

- ✓ Talk with your family about the diverse types of emergencies such as fire, severe weather, earthquakes, and other emergency situations and what to do in each scenario.
- ✓ Identify escape routes from each room in your home and if you are not home, know your exit routes.
- ✓ Pick two meeting places, one near your home and one outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return home.
- ✓ Teach children how and when to dial 911.
- ✓ Have a family communication plan – your family may not be together when disaster strikes so make sure you have everyone's information as well as an out-of-state contact.
- ✓ If you have elderly, disabled or special needs family members or friends that require assistance, be prepared ahead of time for their additional needs.
- ✓ Plan for your pets. Contact [Washoe County Regional Animal Services](#) for sheltering locations.
- ✓ Take a first aid and CPR class.

ASSEMBLE A KIT

YOU MAY NEED TO SURVIVE ON YOUR OWN AFTER A DISASTER, WHICH MEANS ENOUGH SUPPLIES TO LAST FOR 3 DAYS.

- ✓ Food (non-perishable), water
- ✓ First aid kit and prescription medications
- ✓ Clothing, bedding, sanitation (personal hygiene) supplies
- ✓ Important documents and inventory of home contents
- ✓ Credit Cards and Cash
- ✓ Tools (flashlight, battery operated radio, pliers, tape, matches, signal flare, cash etc.)
- ✓ Special items for baby, elderly, disabled, service animals or pets

SIGN UP FOR REGIONAL EMERGENCY ALERT NOTIFICATIONS. IN WASHOE COUNTY, IT IS CODE RED. THERE ARE 5 PRIMARY WAYS YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED.

- ✓ Emergency Alert System (EAS)
- ✓ Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA)
- ✓ Reverse-dial. A pre-recorded message is sent to your landline.
